Meeting started with the appraisal of Vice-Chancellor about groundwork preparation made for CUBET 2014. After the opening remarks, he briefed about the purpose of the meeting and agenda was taken up for discussion.

- The schedule of CUBET 2014 was discussed and important dates were finalized, like online / offline application will be available during 28 March 25 April, 2014. To conduct online examination all over India, 35 examination centres were finalised. Viability of a centre is subject to fulfilment of certain conditions. University reserves the right to merge the non-viable centre(s) with the next nearest viable centre.
- 2. It was discussed and finalized that online examination (Part-A (35) + PART-B (65)) will be conducted for admission in Integrated UG, PG and M.Phil -PhD programmes. The pattern of questions shall be of multiple choices. Part-A comprising general knowledge, reasoning, mathematical aptitude and language skill etc. Part-B shall comprise of various domains of knowledge as per the eligibility criteria in respective discipline. Each question carries 1 (one) mark and the total duration of test will be 2 hrs. There would be no negative marking for wrong answers. After online examination, all applicants shall have to appear in a written test (of 30 marks), followed by interview and/or group discussion (of 20 marks, in total), if required, for assessment of communication skills and general background on scheduled date(s).
