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
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
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From the Vice-Chancellor's Desk

Each edition of the Annual Report is almost like an Encyclopedia, documenting achievements and activities of the University so that our stakeholders can have a fair overview of our collective efforts to steer Central University of South Bihar forward in the present time as well as future. As the Vice-Chancellor of the University, which is in nascent phase and proceeding towards a big transformation, the challenges increase many folds to justify the galaxy of responsibilities. However, disbursing duties as the Vice-Chancellor is very challenging as well as highly encouraging task that provides eternal solace at the end of day. Thanks to my team of highly skilled and focused teaching and non-teaching staff, and students, who always remain on toes and move shoulder-to-shoulder to see Central University of South Bihar among India's best higher educational institutions.

The Academic Year 2017-18 has been a remarkable year which witnessed growth and all round development of the University in several aspects. Let me begin with the 2nd Convocation of the University held on 27th March 2018 at BIT Auditorium in Patna. The passed out students in the Academic Year 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017 were given degrees and medals during the Convocation Ceremony. Padma Bhushan Dr. Vijay P. Bhatkar, the renowned Scientist in the area of Information and Computer technology who developed the Param Super Computer graced the Convocation as Chief Guest. The JANAK of Super Computing in India, Dr. Bhatkar delivered the Convocation Address and said that "India has come a long way since Independence and I am sure the 21st century would belong to India". He urged students to follow tradition and values of the county, and utilize the opportunities not only for academic excellence but for the development of the society. A total of 90 Gold medals were given to toppers which include Chancellor Gold Medal (5), School Gold Medal (25) and Department / Centre Gold Medal (60). Inclusive of the 90 Gold medalists from different courses at UG (Undergraduate), PG (Postgraduate) and M.Phil levels.

Besides the successful conduct of the Convocation Ceremony, the University advanced into a new phase with addition of three new courses, Ph.D. research programmes, revision of syllabus and adoption of full Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) to offer full flexibility in choice of courses to students in addition to a number of workshops, conferences, talks, etc. organized round the year. The students in addition to their academic curriculum proved their brilliance by cracking tests like UGC JRF – NET, GATE, and getting internships and job opportunities in many organisations and educational institutions across the county. Under the guidance of their teachers (faculty members), the talented students participated in many national level sports and cultural competitions, and glorified their Alma Matter with their brilliant performance and winning medals.

Coming back to the infrastructure development (building construction) work, an important component of the growth and development index of any new institution, I am feeling glad to share that the buildings were completed in record time and the University is now fully functional from its permanent campus at Panchanpur. CUSB is now flourishing in its 300 acres campus and welcoming all for quality education and research, and ready to serve as an "Institute of Excellence" and contribute in "Nation Building". We are committed for the excellence and it would continue in the coming years well, and looking ahead to make CUSB a government funded institution of global standard, which is achievable if we work as a team with same zeal and enthusiasm.

New Academic Programmes:

The University has introduced M.Ed. programme during the academic year 2017-18 under Department of Teacher Education.

Students' Enrolment:

Admissions in various programmes are made through a national level combined entrance test that was organised by 10 Central Universities. The Central Universities Common Entrance Test (CUCET) - 2017 was conducted throughout India at 76 test centres for admission in various undergraduate (UG) and postgraduate (PG) Programmes offered under different disciplines for academic year 2017-18. Entrance Test was held on May 17 -18, 2017. After going through written test total of 417 candidates had taken admission in UG and PG courses.

New Appointments / Promotions:

Teaching positions – Altogether 02 faculty members have been appointed during the period on regular basis.

Non-Teaching positions – 12 Non-teaching employee have been appointed during the period on regular basis.

Promotion of Non-teaching staff – Based on the performance / departmental test, 08 Non-teaching employees were promoted during the period.

Grant-in-Aid:

The University has received a sum of Rs. 66.91Crores under General Development Assistance, Rs. 68.09 Crores unspent balance of Previous year and Receipt from tuition fee & other Incomes amounting to RS. 6.93Crores utilized a sum of Rs. 72.12crores during the year 2017 - 18.



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CUSB at a Glance

The Central University of South Bihar is established under the Central Universities Act, 2009 (section 25 of 2009) as Central University of Bihar (name changed under the Central Universities Amendment Act, 2014). The University is functioning from the 300 acres sprawling campus at Panchanpur, about 15kms. from Gaya railway station, on Gaya – Panchanpur Road. The University welcomes all with a grand Entrance Plaza and further provides visual delight with a magnificent multi-storied Administrative Block building. Two School buildings, lecture hall complex, two hostels one each for boys and girls, and mess are other buildings that altogether are like visual treat for visitors, and offering a pristine environs for running academic and cocurricular activities. Along with world class faculty members, high teacher-student ratio, baskets full of elective courses in different programmes, the University offers Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) with total internal evaluation of students' performance at Undergraduate (UG) and Postgraduate (PG) levels. Other highlights of CUSB includes a conducive and research oriented environment with multidisciplinary approach, innovative pedagogies, promising infrastructural facilities and effective students' support system to nurture students' personality in a holistic manner and to prepare them for bright future.

Since its inception in 2009, the University has grown up through different academic programmes. It made a modest beginning by establishing the Centre for Development Studies under the School of Social Sciences and Policy, which offers two year MA in Development Studies. In the academic year 2010-11, the University launched five more PG programmes in Biotechnology, Computer Science, Environmental Science, Mathematics and Statistics. Three more PG programmes, Bioinformatics, Communication & Media Studies, and Psychology were added in the academic year 2011-12. In 2012-13, seven new PG programmes, namely, Life Science, Economics, English, Hindi, Political Science & International Relations, Sociology and M.Tech. in Computer Science were added. In 2013-14, four year Integrated BA. B.Ed. & B.Sc. B.Ed. programmes, and five year Integrated BA.LLB (Hons.) & BSc. LLB (Hons.) programmes were started. From 2013, Integrated M. Phil-Ph.D. programmes were started in almost all disciplines. From 2016-17, the Ph.D. programmes were started in accordance with the UGC regulations. Postgraduate programmes in Education (M.Ed.) and Law (LLM) are also being offered in the University. At present total 04 Undergraduate (UG), 17 Postgraduate (PG) and 12M. Phil-Ph.D. programmes are being offered by 18 Centre / Department.

As stated in Section 5 of the Act, the objective of the University shall be:"... to disseminate and advance knowledge by providing instructional and research facilities in such branches of learning as it may deem fit; to make special provisions for integrated courses in humanities, social sciences, and technology in its educational programmes; to take appropriate measures for promoting innovations in teaching-learning process and inter-disciplinary studies and research; to educate and train manpower for the development of the country; to establish linkages with industries for the promotion of science and technology; and to pay special attention to the improvement of the social and economic conditions and welfare of the people, their intellectual, academic and cultural development."





Central Library

The University has a well-equipped Central Library at its campus. The library has good collection of Title of latest edition of books in sufficient volumes, standard national and international journals. The library has more than 25,000 books to support academic curricula, teaching & research in various science and social science subjects. All the books are barcoded and organized on shelves using Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) scheme. The library subscribes to 117print journals and magazines. The library is stocked with444 bound volumes of journals and 100 project reports and more than 8200 full text electronic (e) journals from renowned publishers

Library services include circulation (issue/return) of books, Inter-Library Loan through DELNET, New Delhi, Current Awareness Service (CAS) for books and journals, photocopy, etc. Users can search the availability of books in library using OPAC, current status of books, due date of return, reserve/hold book, etc. Access to electronic resources is available for students, faculty and officials on their computer within the university premises. Recently, access to these resources has been extended through Virtual Private Network (VPN). 24 x 7 reference service is also being provided through CUSB Virtual Reference Platform. The library is open from 8:00 am to 6:00 pm on all working days and Saturdays.



Central Computing Facility

ICT Infrastructure / Computer Laboratory - This laboratory facilitates a common computational resource for the academic programmes as well as computing resources. The computer laboratory provides a central computing facility to the students for their assignments, projects, dissertation and research related works. In computer lab, printing and scanning facilities are provided. Teachers are provided with individual desktop / laptop with pool printer to assist them in preparing for their lectures and take up their research pursuits. Sufficient numbers of desktops with printer / Xerox facilities are provided at almost all administrative desks.

Internet & Intranet - Internet connectivity is provided under the scheme of National Mission on Education through Information and Communication Technology (NME-ICT) project of Govt. of India. The Intranet network, consisting of gigabyte, Ethernet, and OFC backbone provides connectivity to departments/centres, library, class rooms and administration and other sections.

Resources - At present there are around 500 high performance computers in the University. All computers are equipped with latest and legal operating system and application software to cater to the academic needs. Computers are protected by firewall and reliable antivirus software against computer virus, malware and unauthorized access.

E-Learning Tool (A-View) - Under the NME-ICT scheme, A-VIEW Classroom has been providing opportunity to connect several universities together and creates virtual world for students. It also acts as a Knowledge Café where students can discuss /chat about the lecture after the live class.

Website & E-mail facility - A fully functional Website of the university has been developed. It is maintained and updated regularly. URL of website is www.cusb.ac.in.The University has powerful E-mail system with group mail IDs of students, faculty members and staff.



Facilities for Students

Accommodation- Presently accommodation is provided to boys and girls students in separate hostels within the University premises along with mess facilities.

Health Centre / Medical Facility- The University has its Health Centre, which provides primary level treatment to students for general ailments under the supervision of Medical officers.

Vidyarthi Mediclaim Policy- Vidyarthi Mediclaim is a unique policy of National Insurance Company (NIC) designed to provide health and personal accident cover to the students. All the students of the University are insured under this scheme whereby they are eligible for cashless treatment in authorized hospitals as well as for reimbursement of cost of treatment in other hospitals within the limit of Rs. 50,000.

Scholarship Schemes- In addition to Centre government and state government funded scholarships, the University offers a number of scholarship schemes are offered to deserving and needy students, namely (i) Merit Scholarship to CUSBET / Semester Toppers (ii) Merit-cum-Means Scholarship (iii) GATE Scholarship (iv) Earn While You Learn (EWYL) Scheme & (v) Attendance Based Merit Scholarship.

Psychological Counselling Services- Like physical health, mental health determines efficiency and productivity, which is critically important for teaching-learning process, creativity, and congenial environment in academic institutions. The University adopts a forward looking approach and institutes psychological counselling and guidance for students, faculty and employees under the supervision of experts time-to-time or on need basis.

Campus Placement- The University has a Career Counselling and Placement Cell which takes care of the campus placements and job opportunities for the students enrolled in various courses under different Centres and Departments. Many students got job placement during the session 2017 – 18 in organisations like Azim Premji Foundation, Care India (NGO), Gandhi Fellowship - Piramal Foundation, etc. Students from Media department got placements in Times of India, Hindustan Times, ETV Bharat, Hindustan Dainik, Prabhat Khabar and many other media organisations.

Student Welfare Board- The Dean Students' Welfare (DSW) is shouldering the responsibility of looking after the general welfare of students outside classrooms, which contribute to the growth and development of the personality. The office of DSW also performs the duties and functions viz. (i) make arrangements for educational tours, excursions and participation in sports activities outside the University (ii) to conduct social and cultural activities (iii) form of student bodies (iv) evaluate student - teacher relationship (v) examine and recommend for financial aid to needy students and concession for travel, and other facilities (vi) facilitate fellowships / scholarships for further studies in the country or abroad (vii) health and medical services (viii) student counselling (ix) provide special assistance (if required) to differently abled students or women students (x) provide Student information services (xi) organise alumni association (xii) issue certificates as authorised and delegated by the Vice-Chancellor.

Sports & Cultural / Co-curricular Activities - The University has committees like Games and Sports Activities Committee, Cultural Activities Committee which conducts various activities for students round the year. The students of the University participate in the state and nation level competitions and events under the supervision of co-ordinators of the committees and impress all with their brilliant performances.





2nd Convocation - 27th March, 2018



The Central University of South Bihar (CUSB) awarded degrees to the passed out students during the 2nd Convocation of the University held on March 27, 2018 (Tuesday) at the auditorium of Birla Institute of Technology (BIT) in Patna. Padma Bhushan Dr. Vijay P. Bhatkar, the renowned Scientist in the area of Information and Computer technology graced the occasion as Chief Guest. Referred as the JANAK of Super Computing in India and presently the Chancellor of Nalanda University, Dr. Bhatkar delivered the Convocation Address. Dr. Bhatkar congratulated the CUSB fraternity for scaling the new heights in the short span of nine years since its establishment in 2009. The chief guest specifically mentioned about the contributions of founder Vice-Chancellor Prof. Janak Pandey for shaping up the academia of a new institution. Further, he praised current Vice-Chancellor Prof. Harish Chandra Singh Rathore for carrying ahead the University on a right path and ensuring all round development. Dr. Bhatkar also congratulated the Vice-Chancellor for taking the steps for starting six new postgraduate courses in forthcoming academic session (2018-19) and construction of University's new buildings in Gaya.

Dr. Bhatkar said that India has come a long way since Independence, when it was a poorest country on the globe, but I have seen the flight of the country in the last seven decades. However, contrary to some negatives, I am proud of its accomplishments and it is a matter of pleasure that India is now firmly on the growth path. If it continues further, I am sure the 21st century would belong to India. When we were students, we had to work really hard to collect any information from various sources. Today, students have access to everything. They simply need to utilize the facilities efficiently," Dr. Bhatkar said and urged students to follow tradition and values. As you pass out today, now your real education will begin in the real world. Remember, this time of history will never come back again and you all have to make it count. "It is a great opportunity for students studying in this University as they can utilise their opportunity not only for academic excellence but for the development of the society." He said the graduating students were passing out a time when the country was blessed with a unique opportunity like never before. At present India is the third largest economy and is expected to surpass even the USA by 2040.



It has a rich demographic dividend with an average age of 29 years. India today has one of the largest education systems of the world. Even in the field of science and technology, space technology and computing, the country has achieved a lot despite starting from scratch. We are now launching satellites for the world. The entire world is surprised by India's development, added Dr. Bhatkar.

Earlier, CUSB Vice-Chancellor Prof. Harish Chandra Singh Rathore presented the Annual Report of the University and highlighted the goals and achievements. Prof. Rathore said that the university has moved forward since its inception in 2009 and from the next academic session it will shift to its permanent location at Panchanpur in Gaya. The permanent campus is zero discharge green campus complying with Green Rating for Integrated Habitat Assessment (GRIHA's) five-norm rating. Adding further, Prof. Rathore said an ideal University must focus on integration of education with values. It was a tribute to the CUSB's solid foundation and work ethos that it had achieved "A" grade in NAAC and ranked 94th in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) in 2016. It is because of the University's innovative teaching and evaluation process. Soon with the implementation CBCS (Choice Based Credit System) the students of the University will have full flexibility in designing the curriculum and education on demand, said the VC of CUSB. A total of 675

students passed out in the Academic Year 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017, were given their degrees during the Convocation ceremony. A total of 90 Gold medals were given to toppers which included Chancellor Gold Medal (5), School Gold Medal (25) and Department / Centre Gold Medal (60). Sucheta Sharma (MSc Mathematics), Rohit Kumar (Integrated BSc+BEd), Puja Kumari (MSc Computer Science), Fauzia Parween (MSc Life Science) and Premlata Kumari (MSc Biotechnology) got the 'Chancellor Gold Medal'. The students in specific dress-code (traditional Indian attire) with dazzling smiles were present inside the auditorium to receive their degrees. For girls, the dress code was white colour salwar, kurta and dupatta or white sari with red / maroon border with matching blouse, while for boys it was white cotton kurta and Aligarh payjama. The students were also donning a head dress (pagdi) and a patka with the University logo on one panel and the Convocation logo on the other panel. Many dignitaries like Nalanda University VC Prof. Sunaina Singh, National Institute of Technology-Patna director Prof. P. K. Jain, Mahatma Gandhi Central University (Motihari) VC Prof. Arvind Agarwal, CUSB ex-VC Prof. Janak Pandey, Pro Vice-Chancellor Prof. Om Prakash Rai, Registrar Dr. Gayathri Vishwanath Patil, Controller of Examinations Mrs. Rashmi Tripathi and Finance Officer Mr. Girish Ranjan attended the Convocation Ceremony.



(A) Centre for Biological Sciences

These programmes include well-designed theory and practical courses along with innovation-based training methods in frontier areas of Biological Sciences. (i) Bioinformatics Programme



Guest lecture on 'Wildlife Conservation' (05th September, 2017)

The Centre for Mass Communication and Media (CMS) of Central University of South Bihar (CUSB) organized a guest lecture on 'Role of media in Wildlife Conservation' by an eminent environmentalist Mr. Faiyaz Ahmad Khudsar, CEMDE, Dept. of Environmental Studies, University of Delhi. Mr. Khudsar expressed his deep concern about the degrading environment and wildlife in his lecture. He pointed out the most burning issue i.e. water pollution and explained students about the ill-effect of polluting river Ganga. He further stated that the day is not too far when humans have to rely on recharge coupons for getting their oxygen masks recharged.



Dr. Khudsar threw light on ethical norms that media should follow while covering environmental issues. He also stated that there should be a closer relationship between environmental experts and media professionals for in-depth reporting. Dr. Atish Prashar, Head of CMS presented the vote of thanks.

Training on Human Behaviour Management (18th- 24th September, 2017)

The School of Education, CUSB organised a seven day training programme on "Human Behaviour Management" Under PMMMNMTT Scheme during September 18 – 24, 2017. The program was inaugurated by CUSB Vice Chancellor Prof. H. C. S. Rathore by lightening the lamp. In his inauguration remark the Vice-Chancellor quoted Malaviya Ji that 'Teachers are human behaviour engineers'. They are the architects of the nation in shaping the human behaviour. He said that India has very rich culture and even then we are trying to follow western culture and in this way we are alienating from our roots. Therefore, it's time to take the responsibility and teachers as nation builders can do this effectively.

Prof. S. K. Dubey, Institute of Management Studies Banaras Hindu University, discussed on the topic 'Time Management'. In his lecture, he pointed out that time is money and it must be explicitly managed just like money. Prof. Dubey conducted various activities to realize the utility of the time. Professor B.N. Panda from Regional Institute Education, Bhubaneshwar deliberated interestingly upon stress management. He shared his views upon various factors causing stress among the individual and



suggested various strategies to dissolve it. He suggested that how we can make balance between our individual philosophy and social philosophy to resolve the stress. Mr. Mukesh Keer, Prant Sangthak of Bihar-Jharkhand region of National Level Vivekanand Kendra Kanya Kumari Organization given the training yogic and meditational practices to overcome the stress and to manage the behaviour. He mainly focused on the way in which meditation can be helpful to deal the stress caused by various expectations. The faculty members, students of the Education department actively participated in the one-week long training programme.

Workshop on New Media (05th - 12th October, 2017)

Prof. Arun Kumar Sinha, Professorin-Charge Patna campus explained how new media workshop could be fruitful for the new aspirants of online journalism? Dr. Atish Prasar, (H.O.D., C.M.S.) congratulated the students for organising such a grand event and wished them luck for their future endeavours. Dr. Sujeet Kumar presented the vote of thanks to the dignitaries.

Workshop on Print Media (12th – 16th October, 2017)

The Centre for Mass Communication and Media (CMS) of CUSB organised a five-day workshop on 'Print Production'. The workshop was inaugurated by Mr. B.R.Chatterjee (Human Resource, TOI) in presence of Mr. Sanjeev Kumar (Editor, Vishwa Samvad Kendra), Professor Arun Kumar Sinha (Professor Incharge, CUSB Patna), Md. Mudassir Alam (PRO, CUSB) and Dr. Atish Prashar (H.O.D. CMS). Chief Guest Mr. B.R. Chatterjee in his address motivated students to clarify their goal and focus to be a complete package, being both literally and technically sound. Further, Mr. Sanjeev Kumar shared



his practical experiences with the students and encouraged them to adapt the new changes in print production. Professor Arun Kumar Sinha explained how media inspite of several social implications tries to portray the truth to its readers. Dr. Atish Prashar presented the vote of thanks to the dignitaries and honoured them with mementoes. The workshop was organised with a view to make students understand about the overall process of print production which included reporting, editing, printing and designing. It was also incorporated with field visit to a printing press for deep understanding of the printing process. On the final day the students published wall newspapers based on the lessons they learnt from the experts.

Guest Lecture on Bioremediation by Dr. Irfan (30th January, 2018)

The Centre for Biological Sciences (CBS) of CUSB organized a scientific talk on the topic "Biotechnological based approaches for environmental pollution control" delivered by Dr. Irfan Ahmad Ghazi, a distinguished professor and scientist at the Department of Plant Sciences at University of Hyderabad. Dr. Ifran said that the pollutants come into the environment through various sources like industries, and through food chain, reach to different trophic levels including plants (vegetables and fruits), meat, fishes and finally to human beings. The heavy metal pollution of Mercury, Lead, Arsenic etc. are very common in the areas near river Ganga including Patna and many



other districts of Bihar. Dr. Irfan discussed different methods of bioremediation which are being used in India and abroad and have great potentials in combating different types of pollutants. He also described various biotechnological approaches that can be used for cleaning the environment and also how important various plants (sunflower, mustard etc.) are for making the surroundings less toxic.



Academic Leadership Training Programme (29th January – 3rd February 2018)

A six-day national level Academic Leadership Training Programme (Type-II) was organised by the School of Education of CUSB for educational administrators of different universities/institutions of north eastern and eastern zone of the country under Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT) Scheme of Ministry of Human Resource Development. Professor Ved Prakash, former Chairman of UGC was as the chief guest, thematically explained the growth of higher education system from British Raj to till today, and he told how three universities i.e. Calcutta University, Bombay University and Madras University established in 1857 created a good start of higher education in this country.

Academic Leadership Training Programme (Type – 1) (19th – 22nd February 2018)
