Concept Note

Indian National Movement is known as an unique and unparalleled movement across the world due to colossal mass participation. Each and every section of the vast diversified Indian society contributed to the national movement derived by their unflinching devotion to the national cause. Despite the large plethora of studies on Indian National Movement, there are still some important gaps in the study of the national movement. There are still some important questions which require immediate academic attention in order to understand the National Movement comprehensively and without ideological manoeuvring.

At the outset, the subtleties and the nuances with regard to the understanding of the concepts of patriotism and nationalism there is need to reinterpret the Indian National Movement. Nationalism is a modern construction that has flowed from the western political deliberations. The scholars of the Indian National Movement borrowed the concept of nationalism and projected it on the national movement believing in the maxim of 'Nation in Making'. According to these scholars, the National Movement progressed proportionately with the development of the feeling of the nationalism. But unfortunately, the scholars did not or could not pay attention to the traditional Indian concept of patriotism nurtured and conceptualized by the great Indian classical texts, and which has been flowing since time immemorial. It is this concept of patriotism which once motivated the persons like Rana Pratap and Shiva Ji to fight against the imperial power. In modern period, it is this concept of patriotism which was glorified and contextualized by the leaders and scholars like Aurobindo Ghosh and Bankim Chandra. There is no gainsaying the fact that a number of persons, who sacrificed their lives in the supreme cause of the motherland, were motivated by the traditional concept of patriotism. But this dynamics of the Indian National Movement have been ignored or missed out only due to satisfying certain ideological predilections. Therefore, this perspective of the national movement is required to be discussed and debated by the scholars for a better, unbiased and un-fabricated understanding of the Indian National Movement. Further, there are certain events in the course of the national movement which require urgent revisiting. The events like Khilafat Movement and the Moplah rebellion have been discussed by the scholars from a certain perspective subscribed to a certain ideology. It is the need of hour to understand these events in true historical perspective.

It is mentioned earlier that a number of people sacrificed their lives only in the cause of the motherland. But they are unfortunately still out of the attention of the public at large. Moreover, there are still a number of important national events in the rural area of the country which need to be brought to academic attention. The sacrifice of the common people and the grass-roots events need to be unveiled for a comprehensive and real understanding of the National Movement. Otherwise the national movement would be continuously used as a tool to serve the certain ideological purpose.

The proposed seminar is an attempt to engage the brilliant minds in the discipline for a collective thinking from new perspectives on Indian National Movement to save it from biased ideological and Eurocentric narratives.

2. Patriotism and Indian National Movement
3. Rewriting Khilafat Movement
4. Reinterpretation of Moplah Incident
5. Unsung Freedom Fighters
6. Oral Sources and Rewriting Indian National Movement

8. Revolutionary Activities and Indian National Movement

In addition to the above main sub-themes of the Seminar, the participants are free to present research papers on any other themes related to the topic.
