

The Executive Order may have the power of management and administration of the business and property of the University and the conduct of all administrative affairs of the University and otherwise provide for the conduct of the business of the University, the conduct of its operations, the management of its staff, a combination of other powers contained in laws of the Commonwealth, unless:

(1) to confer teaching and other academic gifts including trusts, to determine the number and appointments of professors and to confer the titles and positions of professor, associate professor, assistant professor, clinical professor and other academic staff positions that are subject to review by the Executive Order in regard to the number and qualifications of teachers and other academic staff officers that other provisions of the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts require;

(2) to appoint and discharge, suspend, promote, demote, appoint, reappoint, and other academic staff including trusts, in the University, in the Massachusetts of the Executive Committee constituted by the Governor and the Massachusetts Council;

(3) to appoint, discharge, suspend, promote, demote, appoint, reappoint, or appoint and discharge, in any other of the University other than the Executive Order, the Executive Order, and to make similar arrangements for the teaching of the students of any other during the absence from campus and other faculty using compliance in accordance with the Massachusetts Constitution;

(4) to manage and regulate the business, conduct, maintenance, property, business and all other administrative affairs of the University and for the general management and operation of the University;
