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Recommendations of the Academic Audit Committee

I. General Recommendations

- 1. A holistic multiple-disciplinary curriculum for various programmes/courses may be offered as per NEP recommendation for multiple entries and multiple exits.
- 2. All the departments should make efforts to enhance the enrolments as the mandate of the university is to help realize the NEP Vision of 50% GER in higher education by 2035.
- 3. All the departments except the Dept. of Development studies may offer UG Programmes at the earliest time as there is high demand for graduation in Politics, History, Economics and Sociology, as the number of civil service aspirants are more in the command area of the university.
- 4. A robust mechanism scheme for student progression and alumni engagement may be developed.
- 5. Research publications and awards, consultancy, and collaboration for research may be promoted.
- 6. Facilities should be provided for both faculty and student exchange programmes with national and international bodies.
- 7. Teachers may be encouraged for conducting frontline collaborative research from inter-department and inter-institutions.
- 8. All the departments should think of signing MoUs with local/national/international institutions of repute.
- 9. Departments should offer new value-added/career oriented courses to make students globally employable.
- 10. The involvement of faculty in funded research and publication in SCOPUS indexed journals require immediate attention.

II. DEPARTMENT WISE RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3. The department can offer some valued added courses on Tourism and Archeology
- 4. The department should conduct some popular lectures on contemporary issues, Great Heroes of India, Lok vidya, Heritage of Indian Culture, Indian Knowledge System and Remembrance of partition, Unsung stories of Indian Independence struggle etc.
- 5. Department may try to develop a heritage club/park in the university premises.
- 6. The department can think of preparing local history of neighborhood panchayats by training the students of PG programme and distributing it as their dissertation subjects.

(iii) DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL STUDIES

- 1. The department should conduct special orientation to the students to clear the Civil Services Examinations and other public service commission examinations.
- 2. Special lectures on International Relations, shared citizenship and related political debates should be held on a continuous basis.
- 3. A Diploma course on "Democratic Decentralization and Development" may be offered from the department especially for the elected representatives of Bihar.

(iv) DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC STUDIES AND POLICIES

- 1. Continuous debate on the development issues on Indian Economy be held under the patronage of the Department for the University as a whole.
- 2. Lecture series on selected topics on a monthly/annual basis can be thought of.
- 3. Using the Econometric lab, the department can start some consultancy and data analysis on commercial basis.

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- 4. All the faculty should complete their Ph.D degree at the most earliest time possible.
- 5. Strengthen the Department in offering separate specialization(s) viz., Financial Economics, Data Science, Experimental & Behavioural Economics, Regional **Economics**
- 6. Produce high-quality project research reports having contemporary policy relevance

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGICAL STUDIES (v)

- 1. Dedicated efforts are required to increase the enrolment in Sociology.
- 2. Being a field related study, the students of the programme should be given adequate provision to visit relevant sites along with teachers and the valuable inputs should be used to prepare some policy/working papers.
- 3. The department can think of offering some Diploma/Certificate courses on socially relevant topics addressing the needs of social workers, health professionals etc.




