While stationed at AS, the nominated students may pursue their Ph.D. thesis research work under the supervision of research scientists from AS, who will officially serve as their External Co-supervisors. The research outcomes performed at AS may be included as a part of their Ph.D. Thesis. The research output is shared by the both institutes.
- 3. Upon approval of the qualifications of the nominated candidates, the Institute of Physics provides them while stationed at AS research assistantship support in terms of per diem.
- 4. The Institute of Physics provides the nominated candidates while stationed at AS opportunities to attend international meetings to present their research results.
- 5. The Ph.D. examination and other formalities are conducted at CUSB according to the current Ph.D. ordinance of CUSB.
- 6. Upon successful completion of the degree requirements, CUSB confers the official Ph.D. degree, while AS issues certificates in recognition that part of the research has been conducted at AS.
- 7. The above program includes mutual visits of scientists and faculties of AS and CUSB. These visits include activities such as lectures, seminars, presentations as well as visits to laboratories and other scientific facilities.

CL. 1 THE PARTIES:

Central University of South Bihar (CUSB), having an expertise in the areas of scientific, technological education and research, established under a special Act of Parliament of Republic of India, incorporated under the Central Universities Act, 2009 having its office at Gaya-824236 (India) as the FIRST PARTY.

and

"Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna. Bihar -800014", here-in-after referred to as "BASU", with a dedicated mandate of teaching, research and extension in Veterinary and its allied subjects having its office located at "Patna, Bihar 800014", as the Second Party, for the purpose of exchange of faculty, students and staff for academic, education, research and administrative purposes.

Central University of South Bihar (CUSB) (India) (The FIRST PARTY), signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the "Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna, Bihar, Patna, Bihar" (The SECOND PARTY), on - 01/09/2022. This Moti is signed in view of exploring the possibilities between the parties in terms of research projects, joint organization of seminars, conferences, schools, and training programmes including exchange of faculties, students, professionals, technicians, and academics for mutual benefit of both the institutions. This Memorandum also seeks joint publications by associated researchers and/or faculty members of both institutions. This MoU would give vast opportunities to the Central University of South Bihar, Gaya (India) to mutually collaborate to mutually collaborate with Bihar Animal Sciences University (BASU), Patna (Bihar).

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) shall be effective from 01/09/2022, with an objective to establish an affiliation by and between First Party and Second Party.

The aforesaid institutions are here-in-after referred to individually as *institute* and collectively as *institutes*.

CL.2 PREAMBLE/BACKGROUND OF MOU:

WHEREAS, the University Grants Commission (Promotion and Maintenance of Standards of Academic Collaboration between Indian and Foreign Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2016, mandates framing of collaboration policy of the University in consistency thereto.

WHEREAS, the globalization of higher education is providing an ever-growing range of opportunities for engagement with universities and organizations across the globe.

WHEREAS, to create a strong and viable science, research and innovation system for high technology-led path for India as envisaged under the policy of Ministry of Science and Technology(2013), Government of India.

CL.3 GENERAL:

CUSB and "BASI" have many areas of common interest in newdomic, education and research such as Animal Science and Agricultural Sciences. Considerable advantage may be gained from their pursuit on a collaborative basis in the fields of academics, education and research, and administration.

NOW THEREFORE, CUSB and "BASU" have decided to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as MoU), which defines the framework for the cooperation of the two institutions set out in the following sections.

CL.4 PROPOSED OBJECTIVES AND EXPECTED OUTCOMES:

In consideration of the mutual promises set forth in this MoU, both institutes/organization are agree to the following collaborative activities in the academic areas of mutual interest, on a basis of equality and reciprocity. The University shall enter into the Memorandum of Understanding for the following objective(s):

- (i) Promotion of inter-institutional research collaboration, staff and students' training and postgraduate research/Doctoral research/Research projects in cutting edge areas by facilitating scientists, staff and students to seek specialized guidance and facilities from both the Institutes.
- (ii) To promote innovation and entrepreneurship by covering and translating technology into products or processes.
- (iii) To encourage the mobility of experts from academia and vice-versa.
- (iv) To device scheme for fostering academia-research-industry partnership.
- (v) To foster resource-optimized, cost-effective innovations for the needs of humanity.

CL.4.1 Faculty/Scientist/Staff Exchanges:

Exchange of faculty/ scientist to the mutual benefit of both institutions shall be done to enrich the educational environment of both institutions through collaboration in teaching, research and development, and consultancy studies in the field of mutual interest with the following objectives:

- (i) To increase educational opportunities through conducting lectures, and undertaking joint research;
- (ii) To jointly publish research paper/article, publish books, monographs, and conference, seminar and workshop proceeding, etc.;



- (iii) Attachment of staff for purposes of curriculum development and review, upgrading of teaching and research skills;
- (iv) Organizing/Participating in seminars, symposiums, summer & winter school(s), and other types of academic discussions;
- (v) Supervising/Co-supervising post graduate student(s);
- (vi) Conducting study tours and joint consultancy work;
- (vii) Running jointly short courses, and break-term programmes:
- (viii) To promote research collaborations through sharing of information, samples, digital records, data, photographs etc.;
- (ix) Jointly propose and engage in research or training programmes sponsored by funding agencies and to exchange on a reciprocal basis researchers and students for limited period;
- (x) To provide both parties with more and better information about each other in order to improve inter-institutional understanding:
- (xi) To mentor the faculty and student for their better academic carrier and future prospects such as providing expertise for establishment of laboratory, library, development of syllabus and new programs, organizing training and workshop.

A specific plan will be worked out for each activity; setting forth detailed arrangements for collaboration will be agreed. Terms and conditions for each visit or an assignment or such exchange, including travel costs will be borne by the commission of the home institution of the participant and local costs will be borne by the host institution. A separate agreement will be entered into giving such details including term of exchange of any intellectual property.

CL.4.2 Student Exchange:

- i) CUSB and "BASU" agree that student exchange will be guided by principles listed below: A home institution refers to the institution, where a student is a full-time student, and from where he/she is expected to post-graduate. A host institution refers to an institution that receives a student for a brief period of time to undertake a pre-determined programme of study or research.
- ii) Exchange student(s) will be selected by mutual agreement between the institutes.
- iii) Both the institutes agree to provide suitable accommodation and/or living expenses for student exchange.
- iv) To avail travel expenses, students can apply for existing funding programs at their respective home institute".
- v) The exchange student(s) will pay tuition and other fees at their home institution.
- vi) For mentoring purpose exchange student(s) will not pay any kind of fees to the best institution.

- vii) For mentoring purpose host institution will not bear any expense of the student(s). If required, host institution may provide accommodation on payment basis.
- viii) In case of a master/doctoral degree programme, students must have a supervisor of home institution and a co-supervisor for day-to-day basis guiding and monitoring of the student of the host institution, and the student shall submit a single thesis at their home institution.

CL.4.3 Other Areas: (See list in Annexure-V)

- (i) To exchange information on research and educational programs;
- (ii) To exchange information on teaching, learning material and other literature relevant to their educational and research programs;
- (iii) To jointly organize short-term continuing education programs on topics of mutual interest and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein;
- (iv) To organize jointly seminars, conferences, training program or workshops on ... topics of mutual interest and to invite each other's faculty, student and staff to participate therein;
- (v) To propose and engage jointly in research or training programs sponsored by funding agencies, and to invite each other's faculty, student and staff to participate therein;
- (vi) To exchange, on a reciprocal basis, students at Post-graduate and Doctoral levels for limited periods of time for purpose of education and /or research;
- (vii) The provision of cultural and intellectual enrichment opportunities for staff and students of both institutes:
- (viii) To use laboratory facilities in specific cases for a limited period; and
- (ix) To permit students, staff and faculty members to use library facility etc.

CUSB and "BASU" agree that detailed terms and conditions that guide each activity identified above will be determined separately and agreed upon by the two institutions. These terms shall include a technical description of the proposed activity, financial arrangements, and person(s) responsible for its implementation.

CL.5 DURATION/VALIDITY/TERMINATION AND RENEWAL:

The Memorandum shall remain in force for a period of Five (05) years commencing from effective date. However, this period may vary from area of collaboration and collaborative programmes. Institutions may extend the term by written agreement signed by both after review.

Any MoU between CUSB and any other International or National Higher Education Institution may at any time during its period of validity, be terminated by one of the parties upon prior notice to the other party in writing not later than six months before the termination date. Once terminated, neither CUSB nor

 $^{\circ}BASU$ will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other institutions may suffer.

However, *CUSB* and "*BASU*" will ensure that the provisions of this Memorandum shall continue to apply to all activities in progress until their completion. The collaboration renewal will be initiated six months earlier and must renew before the date of termination.

CL.6 AMENDMENTS/MODIFICATIONS:

This MoU may be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by the ... representatives or concern persons of both the institutes.

CL.7 IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING:

The parties shall on a regular basis, keep each other informed of and consult on procedure; progress and objective achieve or planned.

The parties shall set specific timeline beforehand and establish manner of monitoring and review of the execution of the area of cooperation and its objectives.

For proper implementation of all criteria and timely completion of the agreed objectives, the CUSB may constitute a monitoring committee. The monitoring committee will review the annual progress of the collaboration and give suggestions if required. However, both parties will arrange six monthly mutual meeting to discuss the proper implementation and goal(s) achieved during that period. The CUSB monitoring committee will consist of the following members:

- 1. HoD Life Science as Chairperson,
- 2. The Registrar CUSB as Member,
- 3. Contact person of the MoU from "SHORT NAME" side,
- 4. A person from the Development Section (If required, Member), and
- 5. A person from the Finance Section (If required, Member).

Each institution shall appoint one member of its teaching/research faculty to coordinate the programme on its behalf. Further, a coordination committee consisting of a programme coordinator from the side of *CUSB* and a programme coordinator from the side of *"BASU"* will periodically review and identify ways to strengthen cooperation between the two institutions.

The parties may with the mutual consent further extend the duration of collaboration.

CL. 8. FINANCIAL OBLIGATION:

For carrying out the collaboration objectives; both the party shall bear all the financial obligations in its respective campus, whether it is about instrument or



animal or chemical. However, in case of individual visit of the faculty(ies) or researcher(s) from both the campus of First Party to Second Party or Vice versa; both the party shall provide local hospitality. With regard to mutually agreed activities the financial obligation shall be determined with consensus of both the parties.

CL.8 CONFIDENCIALITY:

For reasons of sensitivity, the privacy of the individuals or the interests of the 'CUSB'; and 'BASU' Agreement of MoU shall be executed in principles of confidentiality. Both the parties shall abide with the rule of confidentiality and no data or information acquired by any parties of the MoU shall be shared with any third party without taking prior consent of the respective party. However, both the parties shall provide necessary assistance to each other in execution of this MoU. If any data is developed in the course of joint research both will have the joint ownership and with consensus of each other its commercial or industrial exploitation shall be carried out.

CL. 9 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY-RIGHTS:

Ownership of any intellectual property (including but not limited to confidential information, know-how, patents, copyrights, design, rights relating to computer software, and any other industrial or intellectual property rights) developed jointly during the course of this MOU shall be vested in both institutes to this Memorandum and cannot be shared with third party unilaterally.

Both institutes shall have the joint right to determine the commercial exploitation and disposition of such intellectual property, and both institutes shall make joint applications for the registration of the same. Before any registration or commercialization of any intellectual property takes place, the institutes agree to reach a separate agreement covering issues such as exploitation rights and revenue sharing.

Any publication regarding such intellectual property shall only be processes with the prior written consent of both institutes. However, such consent not to be unreasonably withheld.

CUSB and BASU shall be free to use perpetually the results arising out of the collaborating activities for its own internal teaching, research, educational, and publication purposes without the payment of royalties or other fees to the other party.

CL. 10 ARBITRATION CLAUSE/LEGAL LIABILITY CLAUSE:

Participating faculties, staff and students involved in any activities under this Memorandum must adhere to the law of the host countries and rules and regulations of the institutions. Nothing in this Memorandum shall be construed as

creating any legal relationship between the institutes. This Memorandum is a statement of intent to foster genuine and mutually beneficial collaboration.

In case, there shall be a dispute/differences of opinion relating to any aspect of academic, research and administrative cooperation, Concerned Registrar of the CUSB and counterpart of the ""BASU" will jointly resolve the dispute in a spirit of independence, mutual respect, and shared responsibility.

CUSB and "BASU" welcome the establishment of this Memorandum for cooperation and jointly agree to the provisions as set out above.

CL.11SIGNING AUTHORITY:

CUSB and "SHORT NAME" welcome the establishment of this Memorandum for cooperation and jointly agree to the provisions as set out above.

CL. 1 THE PARTIES:

Central University of South Bihar (CUSB), Gaya (India) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the ICMR-Rajendra Memorial Research Institute of Medical Sciences (ICMR-RMRIMS), Patna on 01/07/2023 in view of exploring the possibilities between the parties in terms of collaborative research, education, exchange of faculties, students, professionals, and academics for mutual benefit of both the institutions. This MoU would give vast opportunities for Central University of South Bihar, Gaya (India) to mutually collaborate with one of the most prominent international/ national institutions of the country.

This MoU is effective from 01/07/2023 to establish an affiliation by and between Central University of South Bihar, Gaya (India) having an expertise in the areas of scientific, technological education and research, established under a special Act of Parliament of Republic of India, incorporated under the Central Universities Act, 2009 having its office at Gaya, Bihar -824236 (India) hereinafter referred as CUSB, the FIRST PARTY,

and

Rajendra Memorial Research Institute of Medical Sciences, a premier research institution of Indian Council of Medical Research under aegis of Department of Health Research, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India, having its office located at Agamkuan, Patna, Bihar - 800007 (India) hereinafter referred to as ICMR-RMRIMS, the SECOND PARTY.

The aforesaid institutions are hereinafter referred to individually as *institute* and collectively as *institutes*.

CL.2 PREAMBLE/BACKGROUND OF MOU:

WHEREAS, the University Grants Commission (Promotion and Maintenance of Standards of Academic Collaboration between Indian and Foreign Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2016, mandates framing of collaboration policy of the University in consistency thereto.

WHEREAS, the globalization of higher education is providing an ever-growing range of opportunities for engagement with universities and organizations across the globe.

WHEREAS, to create a strong and viable science, research and innovation system for high technology-led path for India as envisaged under the policy of Ministry of Science and Technology (2013), Government of India.

CL.3 GENERAL:

CUSB and ICMR-RMRIMS have many areas of common interest in academic, education and research. Considerable advantage may be gained from their pursuit on a collaborative basis in the fields of academics, education and research

NOW THEREFORE, CUSB and ICMR-RMRIMS have decided to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding based on the minutes (enclosed) of the meeting resolution held by the Committee Members of CUSB and ICMR-RMRIMS (here-in-after referred to as MoU). which defines the framework for the cooperation of the two institutions set out in the following sections.

CL.4 PROPOSED OBJECTIVES AND EXPECTED OUTCOMES:

In consideration of the mutual promises set forth in this MoU, both institutes/ organizations agree to the following collaborative activities in the academic areas of mutual interest, on a basis of equality and reciprocity. The objectives of the MoU are offto prioritize the inclusive growth of the society and combing priorities of excellence and relevance.

- To promote innovation and entrepreneurship by covering and translating technology into products or processes.
- To encourage the mobility of experts from academia and vice-versa. ii.
- iii. To foster resource-optimized, cost-effective innovations in the field of tropical diseases including Kala-azar.

CL.4.1 Faculty/Scientist Exchanges:

CUSB and ICMR-RMRIMS agree to enrich the research and educational environment of both the institutions through collaboration in teaching, research and development in the field of mutual interest. Activities under this head will include:

- i. Exchange of academic information/materials on research and education programmes, teaching and learning etc.;
- ii. Jointly organizing/Participating in seminars, symposiums, trainings and other types of academic discussions of mutual interest;
- iii. Develop joint research proposals and undertake collaborative research in the field of mutual interest;
- iv. Principal Investigator/Co-Principal Investigator/Mentor in the collaborative research projects shall be decided on mutual understanding during development of such proposals;
- v. Exchange of research components, equipment, knowledge resources, samples, digital records, data, photographs etc. after proper approval from competent authority;
- vi. Facilitating access to the respective field areas, libraries, laboratories;

A specific plan will be worked out for each activity; setting forth detailed arrangements for collaboration. For each visit or an assignment or such exchange, including those concerning salary, travel funding, health insurance, and housing will be borne by the each party from the own resources, worked out between the institutes on a mutual basis. A separate agreement will be entered into giving such details including terms of exchange of any intellectual property.

CL 4.2 Student Exchange:

CUSB and ICMR-RMRIMS agree that student exchange will be guided by principles listed below:

The home institution refers to the institution "A", where a student is a full-time student and the host institution refers to an institution "B" that receives a student to undertake a predetermined programme of study or research."

- i. Ph.D. registration: In light of UGC letter no. F. No. 14-4/2016(PS) dated 25th July, 2016 and CUSB Ph.D. ordinance, ICMR-RMRIMS research scientist/faculty may act as cosupervisor for Ph.D. students of ICMR-RMRIMS. The Ph.D. students enrolled in CUSB would be required to use expertise/facilities or biological samples on a regular basis from ICMR-RMRIMS may also need to include a co-supervisor from the respective department of ICMR-RMRIMS.
- ii. Admission and other requirements including completion of course work shall be governed by the CUSB Ph.D. ordinance.
- iii. Exchange student(s) will be selected by mutual agreement between the "A" and the "B".
- iv. An exchange student(s) will continue to be treated as full-time student at his/her home institution "A".
- v. An exchange student(s) will be considered as a full-time "exchange" student at the host institution "B".
- vi. His/her programme of study at the host institution "B" will be determined by mutual consultation between his/her academic advisor(s) at the home institution "A" and his/her "interim" academic advisor(s) identified by the host institution "B".
- vii. If an exchange student(s) has/have undertaken research, then the host institution "B" will evaluate the exchange student's performance in the research, and issue a letter to that effect, together with a technical "report" of the research carried out.
- viii. If an exchange student(s) has/have undertaken research, then the home institution "A" will take note of the performance evaluation and the technical "report", and take steps in accordance with its own procedures.
 - ix. The exchange student(s) will pay tuition and other fees at their home institution "A".
 - x. For mentoring purposes exchange student(s) will not pay any kind of fees to the host institution "B". However, charges if any, to use any specific equipment/facility or to attend training programs/workshops etc. at Institution "B" will be met by the faculty/student of CUSB from Fellowship, Contingency, and other fees head.
 - xi. For mentoring purposes, host institution "B" will not bear any expense of the student(s).

- xii. Priority will be given to CUSB students to pursue summer training/six month projects for which the required fee, if any, shall be paid by applicant at ICMR-RMRIMS.
- xiii. In case of a doctoral degree programme, students must have a supervisor of CUSB and a co-supervisor of ICMR-RMRIMS for day-to-day guiding and monitoring of the student, and the student shall submit a single thesis at CUSB.

CL.4.3 Other Areas:

- i. In order to promote collaborative research, it is encouraged to apply for joint extra-mural and intramural funding considering the expertise of investigators. In such proposals there will be anallocation of separate budget for each institute. ICMR-RMRIMS, being a medical research oriented institute shall assist in the collection of medical related samples.
- ii. The representatives from CUSB and ICMR-RMRIMS agreed to share the resources available in respective institutes for research and teaching purpose as per mutual understanding.
- iii. Sharing of expertise to establish/ uplift the infrastructure

CUSB and ICMR-RMRIMS agree that detailed terms and conditions that guide each activity identified above will be determined separately and agreed upon by the two institutions. These terms shall include a technical description of the proposed activity, financial arrangements, and person(s) responsible for its implementation.

CL.5 DURATION/ VALIDITY/ TERMINATION AND RENEWAL:

The Memorandum shall remain in force for a period of Five (05) years commencing from effective date. However, this period may be reviews as and when for the collaboration and collaborative programmes is required. Institutions may extend the term by written agreement signed by both the parties after review.

This MoU between CUSB and ICMR-RMRIMS may at any time during its period of validity, be terminated by one of the parties upon prior notice to the other party in writing not later than six months before the termination date. Once terminated, neither CUSB nor ICMR-RMRIMS shall be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other institutions may suffer.

However, CUSB and ICMR-RMRIMS will ensure that the provisions of this Memorandum shall continue to apply to all activities in progress until their completion.

The collaboration renewal will be initiated six months earlier and may be renewed before the date of termination.

CL.6 AMENDMENTS/ MODIFICATIONS:

This MoU may be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by the representatives or authorized persons of both institutes.

CL.7 IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING:

The parties shall on a regular basis, keep each other informed of and consult on procedure, progress and objective achieved or planned.

The parties shall set a specific timeline beforehand and establish a manner of monitoring and review of the execution of the area of cooperation and its objectives.

For proper implementation of all criteria and agreed objectives, the CUSB and ICMR-RMRIMS may constitute a Joint Monitoring committee. The monitoring committee will review the annual progress of the collaboration and give suggestions if required. However, both parties will arrange six monthly mutual meetings to discuss the proper implementation and goal(s) achieved during that period. The CUSB monitoring committee will consist of the following members:

- 1. Vice-Chancellor, CUSB or its nominees as Chairperson
- 2. Director, ICMR-RMRIMS or its nominee as Co-Chairperson
- 3. Registrar or its nominee (Member),
- 4. Two officials from the Development Section, one from each side (Member), and
- 5. Two officials from the Finance Section, one from each side (Member).

Each institution shall appoint one member of its teaching/research faculty to coordinate the programme on its behalf. Further, a coordination committee consisting of a programme coordinator from the side of CUSB and a programme coordinator from the side of ICMR-RMRIMS will periodically review and identify ways to strengthen cooperation between the two institutions.

The parties may with the mutual consent further extend the duration of collaboration.

CL.8 CONFIDENTIALITY:

For reasons of sensitivity, the privacy of the individuals or the interests of the CUSB and ICMR-RMRIMS. Agreement of MoU needs to enter into the undertaking of confidentiality. Before any assurances of confidentiality provided to a SECOND PARTY or vice-versa, the legal situation of ethical compliance must be examined by the Registrar, CUSB and Director, ICMR-RMRIMS. The confidentiality of such Memoranda must be finally determined by the Registrar on advice from the respective Dean/Head of the School/Department taking into account the CUSB's obligations under the current Indian legislations.

CL. 9 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS:

Ownership of any intellectual property (including but not limited to confidential information, know-how, patents, copyrights, design, rights relating to computer software, and any other industrial or intellectual property rights) developed jointly during the course of this MOU shall be vested in both institutes to this Memorandum and cannot be shared with third party unilaterally.

Knowledge or technology developed, which can result in commercialization potential would be IPR protected and filed jointly by both the institutes. ICMR shall be responsible for joint filing and licensing any I.P. coming out from the MoU through joint development.

Important research findings arising out of the activities covered under this MoU may be published in/presented at national and international Journals/Conferences jointly with the mutual consent of collaborators.

The expenses involved in protecting the IPR shall be borne jointly by both organizations. Any IPR/copyright originated from collaborative work between CUSB and ICMR-RMRIMS will be equally-shared by both institutes. Neither party shall reveal intellectual property to any other third party without the prior written concurrence of the second party.

However, the revenue generated will be shared on pre-agreed terms between the parties. Any issue relating to this will be resolved by representatives from both the institutes.

CL. 10 ARBITRATION CLAUSE/ LEGAL LIABILITY CLAUSE:

Participating faculties, staff and students involved in any activities under this Memorandum must adhere to the law of the country and rules and regulations of the institutions.

Nothing in this Memorandum shall be construed as creating any legal relationship between the institutes. This Memorandum is a statement of intent to foster genuine and mutually beneficial collaboration.

In case, there be a dispute/differences of opinion relating to any aspect of academic, research and administrative cooperation, Concerned faculty/Head/Dean/Director/Registrar/Vice-Chancellor of the, CUSB and counterpart(s) of the ICMR-RMRIMS will jointly resolve the dispute in a spirit of independence, mutual respect, and shared responsibility.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU)

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is made and executed onat

BETWEEN

NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF PHARMACEUTICAL **EDUCATION** RESEARCH (NIPER), Hajipur, through Dr. V. Ravichandiran (Director, Additional charge), hereinafter referred to as NIPER-Hajipur [which expression shall unless it be repugnant to the context or meaning thereof shall include the successor in title and assigns]

AND

CENTRAL UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH BIHAR, GAYA (hereinafter referred to as 'CUSB'). The CUSB, Gaya has its Vice-Chancellor place at Gaya - 824236 for promoting among others in the area of Pharmaceutical Research and/or Life Science Research.

The ultimate mission of the Institute is to transfer the technology at the ground level in terms of diagnosis, treatment and control of the disease of the SECOND PART

And

Whereas the Director, NIPER, Hajipur and Vice-Chancellor of CUSB, Gaya, for allowing Ph.D. scholars and PG students of both institutes to do their research activity at CUSB. Gaya under the guidance of researchers of both institutes.

FOR COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH

This MoU sets down the mutually agreed broad framework for joint research and incorporates the modalities for collaboration.

1. PREAMBLE:

- 1.1. NIPER-Hajipur, Department of Pharmaceuticals (DoP), Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers, Govt. of India, functioning at Industrial Area Hajipr-844102-Bihar, India, hereby represented by its Director, is one of the first kind of Pharmaceutical Education and Research Institute in Bihar. The institute is fully residential for the students, enriched with world-class facilities and is empowered with a young dynamic faculty and staff.
- 1.2. Central University of South Bihar, Gaya (hereinafter to be referred to as CUSB, Gaya) specialized M. Pharm. and Ph.D courses in Life Sciences/Pharmacy in Gaya, Bihar.
- 1.3. The activities of NIPER-Hajipur and CUSB, Gaya are in several ways complementary. It is therefore felt that initiating collaborative research programmes would be of considerable mutual benefit.

2. PURPOSE:

1.1 NIPER-Hajipur and CUSB, Gaya desire to implement, in the areas of mutual interest, cooperative and collaborative activities, which would address multidisciplinary scientific, technological and educational problems in the area of parasitic and viral diseases, cardiovascular diseases which are relevant to the interest of the country. This is facilitated by the instrument of this MoU as follows:

ARTICLE - 1

Consistent with the goals and purpose of the collaboration, NIPER-Hajipur and CUSB, Gaya propose to initiate a joint multidisciplinary research initiative in the area of diagnosis and therapeutics, to begin in the area given below.

Environmental poisoning, new drug developments, immunology, Pathology, Biochemistry and Social Science to promote scientific activities between the two organizations.

ARTICLE - 2

- a) For Student Project: A faculty/scientist from CUSB, Gaya or NIPER, Hajipur can guide the project work of MS (Pharm.)/M.Pharm or MSc. students of NIPER-Hajipur or CUSB, Gaya respectively as External Supervisor for a period of 10-12 Months and also guide as Co-supervisor for Ph.D. scholar (period 3-5 years) of NIPER-Hajipur or CUSB, Gaya and with prior approval of the concerned authority of CUSB, Gaya and NIPER-Hajipur
- b) Exchange in Research: Exchange of information and co-operation in research and developments including exchange of research materials, publication and reports.
- c) As per "Plan of Revenue Generation" recently stressed for in its institutes by Dept. of Health Research, GOI, it is proposed that any activities related to collaborative research work viz: Human/Animal, Ethical approval, use laboratory classes are taken by faculties of CUSB, Gaya or NIPER, Hajipur, use of lab instrumentation facilities etc. shall be provided/ permitted for NIPER Hajipur or CUSB, Gaya students, only one payment basis. Educational and research work at CUSB, Gaya or NIPER, Hajipur by the students/Ph.D. scholars of other institutes have not remained free, but they have to pay for availing facilities. The detail of the current fee structure is as follows:
 - I. For Ethical approval: As per the current fee structure of the Animal Ethics Committee, 2000/ per New Project is applicable. This will be vice versa The above fee structure will be effective after the signing of MoU. As the lump sum, ethics committee fee on annual basis is conducted, no special meeting for project review/discussion will be conducted. The projects/amendments/ notifications shall only be considered during the scheduled IAEC meeting,

All the fees/charges will be payable in favour of the Director, NIPER Hajipur/ CUSB, Gaya.

- II. Laboratory facility fees: Rs. 10,000 per student shall be charged for use of laboratory facility (Period: between 1 month to 12 months duration, as applicable). It will be vice-versa.
- III. Remuneration for lecture classes to scientists/Faculty: Rs. 2,000 per class/period to be held either at CUSB, Gaya or at NIPER, Hajipur. This amount shall be directly credited to the bank A/C of the faculties at the earliest, subject to tds if applicable.
- IV. Due to negligence/carelessness of students of NIPER, Hajipur or CUSB, Gaya if any instrument in the laboratory is damaged and reported by the concerned guide for the same, the party shall to pay for the cost of repair of damaged items.
- V. Consumables, Chemicals and plastic-ware for research works at NIPER or CUSB, Gaya students shall be provided by NIPER-CUSB for their research works.
- VI. Hostel facilities for girl's students shall may be provided by either party (as per requirement and will be on a payment basis from students).

ARTICLE - 3

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY:

- a) Important research findings arising out of the activities covered under this MoU may be published in/presented at national and international Journals/Conferences jointly with the mutual consent of collaborators. Knowledge or technology developed, which can be resulted in commercialization potential would be IPR protected and filed jointly by both the institutes. The expenses involved in protecting the IPR shall be borne jointly by both organizations. Neither party shall reveal intellectual property belonging to the other to any third party without the prior written concurrence of the second party.
- b) Any returns arising of commercialization of the Intellectual Property generated out of the R&D programmes undertaken under this MoU, will be shared in proportion to be decided mutually by both the parties, on a case-to-case basis and through the exchange of letters.
- c) Both parties shall abide by the Government Rules as applicable time-to-time."

ARTICLE - 4

NON-EXCLUSIVITY OF THE MoU:

Notwithstanding anything contained in the provisions except Article - 3 of the MoU, either party or both parties together have the unrestricted right to seek additional funds for and/or to cooperate with any agency/institute for any of the projects covered by the MoU.

There will be no financial obligations on both the Parties under this agreement.

ARTICLE-5

Legal Relationship: This MoU shall be construed as a statement of the object to promote a genuine and mutually beneficial collaboration between the Parties. Nothing in this MoU shall be construed to create any legal relationship between the Parties.

ARTICLE - 6

Any article of the MoU may be modified or changed by mutual agreement of the parties hereto in writing. The modifications/changes shall be effective from the date on which they are modified/ extended unless otherwise agreed to.

ARTICLE - 7

All disagreements/differences of opinion/disputes regarding the interpretation of the provisions of this MoU shall be resolved by mutual consultation by the signatories.

However, in case of dispute between persists, the decision of the Vice-Chancellor of CUSB, Gaya/NIPER, Hajipur jointly shall be final and binding on each other. Jurisdiction for the legal dispute shall be at 62 year. Bihar for Arbitration as per the Arbitration & Reconciliation Act.

ARTICLE - 8

GOVERNING LAW:

All research activities undertaken jointly by NIPER-Hajipur and CUSB, Gaya under this MoU will be governed by the Laws of the Republic of India.

ARTICLE - 9

This MoU shall come into force from the date of its signatures and shall remain valid for a period of 3 years. This MoU may be modified, renewed or extended with the mutual written consent of the Parties. Either party may terminate this MoU by giving three (3) months notice in wiring to the other party.

ARTICLE - 10

Force Major: Due to excessive rain, flood or other natural reasons if consumables, chemicals, plastic wares e.t.e. supplied by the NIPER, Hajipur or CUSB, Gaya are damaged, CUSB, Gaya/NIPER, Hajipur will not be held responsible.

Collaboration Agreement

This Agreement is entered into by and between

- Karolinska Institutet (KI) Org No. 202100-2973, Department of Laboratory Medicine SE-171 77 Stockholm, Sweden
- Indian Institute of Technology Mandi (IIT Mandi), School of Civil and Environmental Engineering, Kamand, HP-175005, India
- Indian Institute of Technology Mandi (IIT Mandi). School of Humanities and Social Sciences, Kamand, HP-175005, India
- Central University of South Bihar (CUSB), Department of Environmental Science, SH-7, Gaya Panchanpur Road, Gaya, Bihar 824236, India

separately referred to as Party and jointly as Parties.

1 Background

The Parties have received funding from the Swedish Research Council for the project "Indoor biomass burning contributes to significant particulate matter exposure, chronic human health burden, and an economic drain in rural households", and have agreed to loyally cooperate within the project and to contribute to the project work through exchange of information, research or other tasks, or through funding.

LiU is Project Leader and is responsible for managing the grant and transferring funds to the other Parties in accordance with the approved application and the funder's decision.

This Agreement should not be interpreted as the Parties having agreed on collaboration in the form of a company. The Swedish Act on Partnership and Non-registered Partnership (1980:1102) shall thus not be applicable.

A Party has, with respect to the Project, no employment relationship with the other Party's employees.

2 Definitions

Unless the context clearly states otherwise, the following terms will have the meaning stated below.

Background Information: Information other than Result(s) that a Party is in control of, that clearly contributes to the Project, and that has significance for the realisation of the Project.

Exclusive Result(s): Result(s) Generated solely by one Party.

Exclusive Right: A right to, on legal or constitutional grounds (e.g., industrial confidentiality legislation), prohibit others from using Background Information or Result(s).

Generate: To intellectually contribute to the emergence of Result(s). The contribution shall be comparable to the requirements to be considered author, inventor, respectively rights holder in accordance with Swedish copyright, patent right or other intellectual property rights.

Joint Result(s): Result(s) that is/are generated by two or more Parties jointly.

The Project: The research project is defined in the Project Plan (Appendix 1).

Project Plan: The project plan describes the project. It specifies the Project's scope and direction, as well as the budget and time frame. The project plan also describes the distribution of work between the Parties and the nature of reporting. It is attached as Appendix 1.

Result(s): All information that is Generated or otherwise arises by execution of the Project, and that is associated with Exclusive Rights.

3 The Agreement

This document ("Collaboration Agreement") along with the appendices, will govern the collaboration. The Collaboration Agreement together with the appendices is referred to as the "Agreement".

In case of contradictions between the provisions of this Collaboration Agreement and the appendices, the documents shall prevail in the following order:

- 1. Appendix 2
- 2. The Collaboration Agreement
- 3. Appendix 1

4 General commitments and responsibilities

- 4.1 The Parties commit to comply with the terms in the funding body's decision, Appendix 2.
- 4.2 The Parties undertake to assist LiU as the Project Coordinator in reporting their parts of the Project in order for LIU to be able to submit such reports as the funding body may require.
- 4.3 The Parties undertake to use their best efforts to complete the Project in accordance with the Project Plan and with the care and professionalism that reasonably can be expected. If the required competence or time for a certain task is lacking, the Party may engage a Subcontractor, provided that this is approved according to the Project Plan or that the other Party in writing in every single case accepts this. The content and implementation of the Project are described in more detail in the Project Plan.
- 4.4 The Parties must see to it that employees and subcontractors who take part in the Project meet the requirements of this Agreement, including but not limited rights to Result(s), Publication, and handling of Confidential Information.

5 Financial commitments

LiU commits to transfer funding to the Partners according to the following payment plan: Karolinska Institute

• A maximum amount of 400 000 SEK (as mutually agreed upon by the Parties according to projected annual expenses) will be transferred in installments starting 1 August 2023 and ending 30 December 2026.

Indian Institute of Technology Mandi

 A maximum amount of 650 000 SEK (as mutually agreed upon by the Parties according to projected annual expenses) will be transferred in installments starting 1 August 2023 and ending 30 December 2026.

Central University of South Bihar

 A maximum amount of 600 000 SEK (as mutually agreed upon by the Parties according to projected annual expenses) will be transferred in installments starting 1 August 2023 and ending 30 December 2026.

Every year on request from LiU, utilization of funds (transferred from Sweden) will be provided by individual partners signed by their respective economic authorities to be submitted to the funding agency (Vetenskapsrådet) as per financial reporting norms.

6 Organisation

6.1 The Project work shall be conducted in accordance with the Project Plan. Each Party is responsible for the implementation of its commitments.

The project has a steering group consisting of Parties representing India and Sweden directly involved in implementing this project. The Parties will undertake all decisions relevant to the project.

7 Confidentiality

- 7.1 "Confidential Information" means such information that the disclosing Party has disclosed during the Project and that:
 - is clearly identified as "Confidential Information"; or
 - if verbally disclosed, was designated as Confidential Information at the time of the disclosure.
- 7.2 The terms of the Confidential Information as provided in this Agreement shall be applicable for three (3) years after the Project is completed.
- 7.3 The receiving Party undertakes not to use Confidential Information for any purpose other than in accordance with this Agreement or to disclose any Confidential Information to any third party without the disclosing Party's prior written permission, provided that this is not required for an investigation into research misconduct, other deviation from good research practice or for a review. If the Party has to disclose Confidential Information to a third party due to an investigation into research misconduct, other deviation from good research practice or for a review, the Party must ensure that the Confidential Information is protected in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

The receiving Party shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that the sensitive nature of the Confidential Information is not compromised. The receiving Party may only disclose Confidential Information to employees and others engaged by the Party to carry out the Project that need the information for the implementation of the Project. The receiving Party shall ensure that the persons who have received the Confidential Information comply with the provisions of this Agreement.

- 7.4 Confidential Information does not, however, include information that:
 - at the time of disclosure was publicly known or that subsequently becomes publicly known otherwise than by breach of this Agreement;
 - the receiving Party can demonstrate what was known to him prior to the disclosure;
 - the receiving Party becomes duly aware of, independent of the other Party and/or
 - that a Party discloses as a result of mandatory law or court order.

8 Personal data

Regarding the processing of personal data, current legislation shall apply, and contracts of personal data processing data transfer agreements or joint controller agreements shall be drawn up in those situations where it is required by law.

9 Result(s)

- 9.1 Right of ownership
- 9.1.1 Result(s) shall be the property of the Party who Generated it.
- 9.1.2 Result(s) Generated by two or more Parties shall be owned by them jointly with shares corresponding to the respective Party's intellectual contributions to the emergence of the Result(s).
- 9.1.3 Under the Swedish Act (1949:345) on the right to employees' inventions, the right of ownership of patentable inventions is held by the researcher, employed at LiU and KI as a teacher, who Generated the invention. Because of this, the formal party to a contract regarding access rights to or transfer of patentable Result(s) is primarily the researcher. Pursuant to at any time occurring custom at LiU and KI regarding IPR, other IPR may be covered by the aforementioned exception, and other employees of LiU and KI may have the right to be treated as if he possessed such a teaching position which the exemption covers.
- 9.1.4 The Parties shall, in writing and without delay, inform each other of Result(s) that may result in patents or protection of designs.
- 9.1.5 The Act (1904:48 s1) on co-ownership does not apply to Joint Result(s). Measures not specifically mentioned in this Agreement that concern Joint Result(s) require the consent of all co-owners.

9.2 Access rights

- 9.2.1 The Parties undertake to grant access rights to Result(s) to the other Parties in such a manner that the Project can be carried out in accordance with the Project Plan.
- 9.2.2 The Parties have a right which is non-exclusive, free of charge, and unlimited in time, to use all Result(s) in their own non-commercial activities (single license without a right to sublicense or license to a third party). For other types of use, a reasonable and market-based remuneration will be paid to the owner of the Result(s). A Party that has been excluded or that has withdrawn from the Agreement has no such right unless the other Parties unanimously decide so separately.
- 9.2.3 Background Information to which a Party holds Exclusive Rights may be used free of charge in the Project by another Party provided the holding Party cannot grant access rights based on contracts with third parties or if the grant would bring significant damage to the holding Party.
- 9.2.4 A Party who owns Result(s) has the right to use another Party's Result and Background Information associated with Exclusive Rights to the extent necessary for the Party to be able

to use such Result(s) for its own operations. Requests for access must be made in writing. The Party with ownership is entitled to reasonable compensation. The right to compensation applies for the period the Exclusive Right remains. A Party that has been excluded or that has withdrawn from the Agreement has no such right unless the other Parties unanimously decide so separately.

- 9.2.5 The right to use the Background Information in accordance with the Project Plan or other agreed access rights under this provision includes only a single license, without the right to sub-licence unless otherwise agreed.
- 9.2.6 If there are any limitations for the use of Background Information, the Party that introduced the Background information to the Project shall in writing notify the other Parties of the limitation when introducing it.

10 Transfer of shares in Joint Result(s)

10.1 A joint owner wishing to transfer its share of Joint Result(s) (the Transferor) shall submit a written request to the joint owners. The other joint owners are then allowed to submit a written offer to the Transferor within thirty (30) days from receipt of the request by the other joint owners.

Transfer in accordance with the above paragraph shall be in accordance with commercially reasonable terms. If no agreement can be reached regarding the terms and conditions for acquisition within sixty (60) days from when the Transferor gave notice of its interest as described above, the Transferor may freely dispose of the Result(s). Should the Transferor thereafter, within six (6) months, reach an agreement with a third party to acquire such Result(s), the conditions offered to the third party may not be more favourable than those offered to the other joint owners as described above. Should the conditions, despite this, be more favourable, the other joint owners shall have the right to take possession of the Result(s) on the same conditions as those offered by the third party.

- 10.2 A Transfer to LiU's holding company or companies where LiU's holding company holds ownership shall thus not be considered the third party.
- 10.3 A Party's access right is not affected by the transfer of ownership of Result(s). If the transfer is made to a third party, the Transferor shall ensure that the access rights of all Parties are secured in the transfer agreement.

11 Publication

- Publication or public disclosure of Result(s) shall be made in accordance with good international practice for the publication of research results. Such good international practice includes, for example, not publishing someone else's Exclusive Results or information without their consent. In accordance with normal academic practice, all investigators and contributors to a publication will be acknowledged, always in compliance with recognized standards concerning publication and authorship, including the most recent "Recommendations for the Conduct, Reporting, Editing and Publications of Scholarly Work in Medical Journals" developed by the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE).
- No later than thirty (30) days before publication or public disclosure, the Party shall supply a copy of the proposed publication to the other Parties for examination. The examining Parties are entitled, within twenty-five (25) days of receiving the proposed publication, to request that its Confidential Information shall be excluded if publication or public disclosure of it would be contrary to the Party's essential business or academic interests. The Party that makes such a request must identify the Confidential Information in the publication.

- If a Party wishes to seek the protection of intellectual property, publication may be delayed until an application is made, however not for more than ninety (90) days from the planned publication date. Subsequently, the Party is always allowed to publish the Result(s).
- If the Party does not present a request that Confidential Information be excluded according to 11.2 or that publication shall be delayed according to 11.3, this shall be considered as the Party's consent for publication.

12 Amendments and additions

Amendments and additions to this Agreement shall be made in writing and be signed by authorised representatives of all Parties in order to be valid.

13 Term of the Agreement

This Agreement applies from Aug 1, 2023, to Aug 1, 2027: until the Parties have fulfilled their obligations according to the Agreement.

14 Termination of the Agreement

- 14.1 A Party may withdraw from this Agreement with four (4) months' notice insofar as it is possible to complete the Project without that Party. It is the responsibility of the withdrawing Party to fulfil all of its obligations during the notice period, as stated in the Project Plan. A Party that terminates its participation in the Agreement in advance shall make sure the effect of the withdrawal on the remaining Parties' continued participation in the Project is limited as far as possible.
- 14.2 If a Party breaches this Agreement in any material manner and fails to remedy such a breach within thirty (30) days of the receipt of a written request, this Party can be expelled if the other Parties are in agreement on this.

- The Parties' liability comprises only damage or loss which the Party has caused the other Party through material breach of any provision of this Agreement and /or through gross negligence or a willful act or omission during the execution of the Project. The liability does not include compensation for indirect damages or consequential damages, Indirect damages means, for example, loss of profit, loss due to the Result(s) not being useable as intended, loss due to a reduction of revenue or production, and non-material damage. Party's liability due to damage or loss is limited to an amount equal to the errant Party's share in the Project.

If one of the Parties objects to Mediation or if the Mediation is terminated, the dispute shall be finally resolved by arbitration in accordance with the Rules for Expedited Arbitrations of the Arbitration Institute of the Stockholm Chamber of Commerce.

The seat of arbitration shall be Stockholm. The language to be used in the arbitral proceedings shall be English. The dispute shall be decided in accordance with Swedish law.

Notwithstanding the above, disputes arising between Parties who are Swedish public authorities cannot be settled in court and shall be settled through good faith negotiations between the Parties.

Clear, due debts may be collected through an application for a payment order or a summons.

TATA INSTITUTE OF SOCIAL SCIENCES (TISS), MUMBAI

This Memorandum of Understanding is intended to establish academic cooperation between Department of Economic Studies and Policy, Central university of South Bihar Gaya and the Labour Market Research Facility (LMRF), School of Management and Labour Studies, Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai.

1. OBJECTIVES OF AGREEMENT

The objective of this agreement is to develop academic cooperation to facilitate advancement of knowledge and to cooperate in their mutual interest for a range of higher educational activities.

2. AREAS OF COOPERATION

Subject to the availability of funds, resources and approval of the competent authorities of the Universities, institutions agree:

- a) to prepare policy papers through joint research projects
- b) to cooperate in individual projects
- c) to jointly organize seminars, workshops on subjects of mutual interest and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein
 - d) to exchange of researchers (faculty and research scholars)
- e) to provide opportunities for professors and researchers to give lectures
- f) To share library facilities
- g) To search for opportunities to collaborate in the future

3. IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING

Each institution shall engage one member of its teaching/research faculty as coordinator on its behalf. Further, a coordination committee, consisting of Nominee of the Vice-chancellor, Central University of South Bihar and Nominee of the Vice chancellor, Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai.

4. Duration, Renewal AND Termination of The Agreement

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) will become effective immediately after signature by the representatives of both the Universities i.e., of Central University of South Bihar Gaya, and the Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai for a period of 3 Years and is subject to revision/ modification by mutual agreement.

The parties may with the mutual consent further extend the duration of agreed period. This agreement may, at any time be terminated by either party upon prior notice to the other party in writing not less than SIX (6) months but termination notice is not required if the termination date of the agreement is left less than six months from the notice. In such circumstances, termination date of the agreement shall be the termination date, provided that such termination shall not affect the accomplishment of any ongoing program or activity at the time the notice of termination is given.



- 5. Confidentiality: For the reason of sensitivity, privacy of individuals or the interests of the CUSB, both the parties shall maintain the confidentiality of data, communications, transcripts etc. Ethical and legal aspects should be complied by both the parties. Parties shall not infringe the copyright or moral right of any other person or parties. However, parties may work under permissible limit provided under law of the land.
- 6. Intellectual Property Rights: Ownership of any intellectual property developed jointly during the enforcement of this MoU shall be vested in both the institutes to this memorandum and shall not be shared with third party unilaterally. Both the institutes shall have the joint right to determine the commercial exploitation and disposition of such intellectual property, and both institutes shall make joint applications for the registration of the same, wherever required.

Before any registration or commercialization of intellectual property take place, the institutes agree to reach a separate agreement covering issues such as exploitation of right and revenue sharing. Any publication regarding such intellectual property shall only be processed with prior written consent of both the institutes. However, such consent not to be unreasonably withheld.

Both the institutions shall be free to use perpetually the results arising out of the collaborating activities for its own internal teaching, research, educational and publication purposes without the payment of royalties or other fees to the other party. No party shall infringe the copyright/moral right of the other, IPR etc.

- 7. Financial Aspects: Both the parties shall bear their own financial responsibilities.
- 8. Arbitration clause/Legal Liability clause: Both parties may mutually refer any disputes to the arbitration as per the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996. In case, the dispute does not resolve through arbitration, the dispute may be referred to the Vice Chancellor, CUSB and Head of the Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai, who will jointly resolve the dispute in a spirit of mutual respect, independence and shared responsibilities.

9. Amendments

This Memorandum of Understanding may be revised/amended by the representatives of both the universities.

10. Approval

CL.4.2 Student Exchange

CUSB and VV Biotech agree that student exchange will be guided by the principles listed below:

A home institution refers to CUSB, where a student is a full-time student and from where they are expected to graduate. A host institution refers to an institution "B" that receives a student for a brief period to undertake a pre-determined programme of research.

- a) Exchange of student(s) will be made by mutual agreement between the CUSB and the VV biotech.
- b) Such student(s) will continue to be full-time students at their home institution, CUSB.
- c) Similarly, exchange student(s) will be considered full-time "exchange" students at the host institution VV Biotech.

- g) Suppose an exchange student(s) has/have undertaken research. In that case, the host institution "B" will evaluate the exchange student's performance in the study and issue a letter to that effect, together with a technical "report" of the research carried out.
- h) Suppose an exchange student(s) has/have undertaken research. In that case, the home institution "A" will take note of the performance evaluation and the technical "report" and take steps following its own procedures.
- i) VV Biotech agrees to provide suitable accommodation and/or living expenses for student exchange.
- j) The exchange student(s) will pay tuition and other fees at their home institution, CUSB.
- k) For mentoring purposes, exchange student(s) will not pay any fees to the VV Biotech.
- 1) For mentoring purposes, host institution VV Biotech will provide free accommodation.
- m) In the case of a doctoral degree programme, students must have a supervisor of CUSB and a mentor from the host institution for a day-to-day basis guiding and monitoring the student of the CUSB. The student shall submit a single thesis at their home institution/country with the acknowledgment of VV biotech in the acknowledgment section.

Any MoU between CUSB and VV Biotech may, at any time during its period of validity, be terminated by one of the parties upon prior notice to the other party in writing not later than three months before the termination date. Once terminated, neither CUSB nor VV Biotech will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other institutions may suffer.

CUSB and VV Biotech will ensure that the provisions of this Memorandum shall continue to apply to all activities in progress until their completion.

The collaboration renewal will be initiated three months earlier and must renew before the date of termination.

CL.7 IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING

Regularly, the parties shall keep each other informed of and consult on the procedure, progress, and objective achieved or planned.

5. A person from the Finance Section (If needed, Member).

Each institution shall appoint one member of its teaching/research faculty to coordinate the programme on its behalf. Further, a coordination committee consisting of a programme coordinator from the side of *CUSB* and a programme coordinator from the side of *VV Biotech* will periodically review and identify ways to strengthen cooperation between the two institutions. The parties may, with mutual consent, further extend the duration of the collaboration.

CL.8 CONFIDENTIALITY

For reasons of sensitivity, the privacy of the individuals, or the interests of the CUSB, the agreement of MoU needs to enter into the undertaking of confidentiality. Before any assurances of confidentiality are provided to a SECOND PARTY, the legal situation must be checked by the Registrar's office of the CUSB as well as the regulatory office of VV Biotech. The secrecy of such MoU must be finally determined by the Registrar on advice from the respective Dean/Head of the School/Department, taking into account the CUSB's obligations under the current Indian legislation.

CL. 9 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

Ownership of any intellectual property (including but not limited to confidential information, know-how, patents, copyrights, design, rights relating to computer software, and any other industrial or intellectual property rights) developed jointly during the course of this MOU shall be vested in both institution to this Memorandum and cannot be shared with the third party unilaterally.

National Institute of Technology Patna located at Ashok Rajpath, Patna-800005, Bihar, India, (hereinafter called NIT Patna, which shall include its successors and assignees) on the first part.

AND

Central University of South Bihar, located at SH-7, Gaya Panchanpur Road, Village Karhara, Post- Fatehpur, Gaya – 824236, Bihar, India (hereinafter called CUSB, which shall include its successors and assignees) on the second part.

NIT Patna and CUSB shall individually be known as a Party and Collectively as Parties.

1. Scope:

The scope of collaboration in this Memorandum of Understanding includes initiatives under the following categories:

- 1. <u>Academic Programs</u>: Exchange of expertise and resources between the two institutions to enhance the quality of academic programs, curriculum development, and student learning experiences.
- 2. Research Activities: Collaborate on research projects in areas of common interest, share research facilities and equipment, and promote joint research initiatives to foster innovation and academic excellence, along with Joint supervision of Postgraduate and Ph.D. students.
- 3. <u>Faculty and Student Exchange</u>: Facilitate faculty and student exchanges between the two institutions, allowing them to benefit from diverse perspectives & experiences and to undertake a pre-determined program of study or research.
- 4. <u>Joint Workshops and Seminars</u>: Organize joint workshops, seminars, and conferences to promote knowledge sharing and interdisciplinary research collaboration.
- 5. <u>Short Term Programs</u>: Jointly organize short-term continuing education programs on topics of mutual interest and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein.

- 6. Resource Sharing: Share libraries, laboratories, and other educational resources, which can reduce duplication of efforts and improve overall efficiency.
- 7. <u>Technology Transfer</u>: Collaborate on technology transfer initiatives, facilitating the conversion of research findings into practical applications for the benefit of society and industry.
- 8. <u>Capacity Building</u>: Training and capacity building programs to enhance the skills and knowledge of faculty, staff, and students.

2. Student & Faculty Exchange:

- 1. Both the institutes will encourage the students for summer research internship at the other Institute, subject to meeting the eligibility criteria. The internship program may be conducted in online/offline mode at the discretion of the Institute.
- 2. Students enrolled in PG/PhD programs at either Institute can spend a semester at the other Institute under the Visiting Students Program. The Visiting Students will be permitted to take courses on credit as well as participate in research activities/internships/project work, with the prior consent of the project/research supervisor. The credits earned during the semester at the host Institute shall be transferred to the other Institute.
- 3. The admission or tuition fees for Visiting students shall be decided on the basis of the terms and conditions mutually agreed upon by both the Institutes.
- 4. Both the Institutes shall provide an opportunity to the students currently pursuing PG, to be considered for admission to the PhD program at the other Institute under the Start Early PhD Program.
- 5. The faculty of both NIT Patna and CUSB may apply for suitable postdoctoral positions or any other similar opportunities available at the other Institute. Availing any such opportunity at the other Institution shall be subject to the extant rules of the respective Institute, in regard to relieving the faculty of their regular duty in the parent institution.

3. Research Collaboration:

- 1. Both the Institutes shall help to identify and invite faculty members from the other institute to participate in research or development programs. The terms and conditions for such participation will be worked out by mutual agreement between the Institutes.
- 2. Both the Institutes shall endeavor to help set up Incubation Centers, in collaboration and to mentor research-based start-ups and industry projects based on mutual agreement.
- 3. Each institute shall nominate one of its members as its representative in-charge of the collaborative program, and the progress of these programs shall be reviewed every six months.
- 4. The final approval of any project will depend on the availability of guaranteed support funds.

4. General Terms:

Any specific activity developed under this MOU shall be detailed in a subsequent agreement, signed by each institution's authorized signatory, which will describe the scope of the proposed activity, intended outcomes, budget, and responsible departments or individuals.

5. Tenure and Termination:

This MoU will remain valid for five years from the date of Signing and may be amended, renewed, terminated by mutual agreement. The termination shall be by a prior notice of not less than three months by either of the parties. In the event of termination, both parties shall ensure that the interest of students working/projects under this MoU is safeguarded to the extent possible.

6. Financial Obligations:

Both parties understand and agree that this memorandum creates no financial obligations on either party, and all financial arrangements will have to be negotiated and will depend on the availability of funds.

7. Legal Relationship:

This MoU shall be construed as a statement of purpose to promote a genuine and mutually beneficial collaboration between the Parties, and nothing in this MoU shall create any legal relationship whatsoever between the Parties.

8. Intellectual Property:

Both the Institutes shall respect each other's rights to intellectual property. Further, the intellectual property rights that arise as a result of any collaborative research or activity under this MoU will be worked out on a case-by-case basis and will be consistent with the officially laid down IPR policies of the two Institutes.
